Light it up!

It's customary to fly the flag only from sunrise to sunset. You may display your flag 24 hours a day if it is illuminated properly.

How's the Weather?

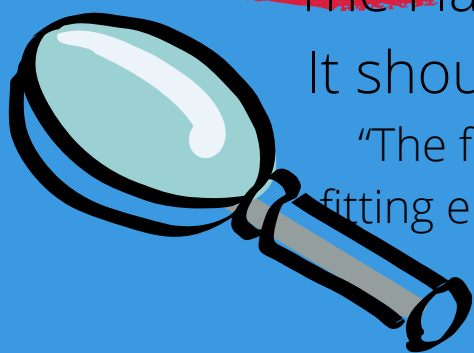
The Flag should not be displayed during inclement weather unless you have an all-weather flag.



Inspect often

The Flag is a living representation of our country. It should be replaced when frayed and tattered.

"The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning".



Hoist Briskly

The flag should be hoisted briskly taking great care not to let it touch the ground. It should be lowered ceremoniously and folded properly into a triangle. Non-uniformed viewers present should remove hats and cover their hearts with their right hand.
