

HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR FLAG'S MATERIAL



Some flags are used for outdoor display, others for memorial purposes, and still others for indoor display. Depending on its use a flag can be made out of nylon, cotton, polycotton, polyester, or two-ply spun polyester.

PERMA-NYL™ - NYLON

When in doubt, Choose Perma-Nyl, the most durable and serviceable option. Nylon retains color well, flies nicely in a light breeze, dries well, and is easily cleaned. And yes, the flag planted on the moon in 1969 is a 3'x5' Nylon!



BEST™ - COTTON

Best™ Cotton Flags have a traditional look & the material is extremely beautiful. This fabric has a natural, quality feel. Like anything made of cotton, it is less durable and should be used for decorative or ceremonial purposes.



POLYCOTTON BLEND OR POLYESTER

These materials are economical yet attractive. They are excellent for temporary use or where cost is an issue. Never let cost prevent you from raising your Flag.



KORALEX II - TWO-PLY, SPUN POLYESTER

This premium material holds up well in windy or harsh conditions. Because it is spun, it has the feel of cotton, but its synthetic nature gives it the durability of nylon.

Ideal if you fly your Flag 24/7 or extreme weather conditions.



DURATEX II- TRICOT KNIT POLYESTER

This material is lighter than Koralex and flies beautifully. This material is also designed for wet, windy conditions and repels water like nylon. Excellent color retention and a nylon-like shine with the durability of polyester. A real Win - Win Situation



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
